me mill the grain?

Darrel got me a grain mill so I can now mill my own grain into flour. I have had a wonderful time making many many different breads. I have made regular bread like for sandwiches, dinner

rolls, cinnamon rolls (several varieties), garlic cheese rolls, pizza crust, and garlic pizza. We have also made cookies, gravy, etc using the flour that we have milled. I am eagerly awaiting some new grains so I can try some new recipes.

Is it hard? It it not hard, the machines do all the work. To mill the grain takes about 10 minutes for 15 cups of flour. Then you make the bread and it takes about 12-15 minutes to prepare,

then you let it rise. Then you bake it. Unless it is pizza crust and you cook it right away without letting it rise. You can also put it in the refrigerator and then pull it out the next day, let it rise and bake it. I have done that too! To get the most nutritional value you want to use the flour right away. But it can last 3 days and still be nutritional and 7 days before the oils make it go bad.

Stephen did ask "Mom, are we ever going to buy bread from the store again?" I told him we probably would, but not if I could help it.

We also planted some of the grain and are watching it grow. In just a few days it is several inches tall. The kids have chosen which ones they think will win the growing contest.








Before the show, the kids and dad played frisbee and football in front of the big screen.


